

The Reverend Dr Gordon Giles

The Reverend Dr Gordon Giles was born in London and went to school in High Wycombe and Wales before gaining a First in music and aesthetics at Lancaster University. An M.Litt in Philosophy at Cambridge University followed and then he worked as Chaplain for the Missions to Seafarers in the North-east of England. After studying theology at Ridley Hall Cambridge, he was ordained in Ely Cathedral and served a curacy at the Church of the Good Shepherd, Cambridge, where he helped found a Credit Union. In 1998 he became Succentor of St Paul's Cathedral in London. In 2003 he became Vicar of St Mary Magdalene's Church in Enfield, North London, and between 2008-2019 also served as Director of Post-Ordination Training in the Edmonton Episcopal Area of London Diocese. He has written several books on church music, hymnody and liturgy and devotional Lent and Advent Books for the Bible Reading Fellowship (BRF). As well as being one of the editors of the newly published 'Ancient and Modern' hymnbook, he is also a Director of the English Hymnal Company. Gordon was awarded a PhD in Music, Theology and Liturgy by Middlesex University in 2013. Gordon loves to travel and has led many pilgrimages to the Holy Land, Turkey, China and Europe, mostly with McCabe Travel. He is married to Jessica, who teaches Law for the Open University, and has a daughter Maria (16).

Bishop We have come together in the name of Christ to offer our praise and thanksgiving, to hear and receive God's holy word, to install Gordon Giles as Canon Chancellor and to give thanks for our fellowship one with another in the Gospel. Let us therefore pray for God's abundant grace and blessing, that by the power of the Holy Spirit we may give ourselves to the service of God and his kingdom. The Presentation

The Canon-designate is presented to the Bishop by Helen Dimmock, Ecclesiastical Secretary to the Crown and Lord Chancellor

Bishop James, I present to you Gordon Giles to be instituted to a Residentiary Canonry of this Cathedral Church.

The Letters Patent are read

The Canon-designate and presenter return to their seats

The Bishop introduces the Canon-designate to the congregation

Following the introductions, the Bishop invites the Canon-designate to stand before him and says

Bishop It appertains to the Office of Canons to be counsellors and advisers of the Bishop in holy things, as well within as without the Chapter; to be a student of sacred learning, and of all such matters as tend to establish and confirm the truth of the Gospel and the discipline of the Church; to be diligent in prayer for God's blessing upon our labours and those in this diocese, especially for those of this Chapter; to maintain Christian fellowship and hospitality as far as in them lies; to be zealous for the beauty and service of this Cathedral Church of Christ and the Blessed Virgin Mary, and to remember with thanksgiving those who have gone before in this place in the confession of God's holy name, particularly the Founders and Benefactors of this Cathedral Church.

Will you endeavour to do all these things with the help of God?AnswerI will do so, the Lord being my helper.

The candidate makes and subscribes the Declaration of Assent and the Oaths of Allegiance and Obedience, and the Oath to observe the Cathedral Statutes

- Bishop Almighty God, who has put into your heart to make these solemn promises, give you grace to perform them, that, together with this whole Chapter, you may inherit everlasting life.

The Institution

The Bishop reads the Deed of Institution and the Canon-designate kneels before the Bishop, holding the seal flat between the palms of his hands

Bishop Gordon, receive this charge, which is mine as well as yours, in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.All Amen.

Bishop Let us pray for the gift of the Holy Spirit.

The congregation remains seated or kneels

A time of silent prayer is kept, at the end of which the choir sings

The Installation

The Bishop gives the Mandate of Installation to the new Canon Chancellor saying

Bishop This is our Mandate of Installation which you shall cause to be handed to the Dean of this Cathedral Church.

The new Canon Chancellor hands the Mandate to the Dean and says:

Dean Philip, I present to you this Mandate of Installation from the Bishop earnestly praying that in accordance therewith you will install me to a Canonry in this Cathedral Church.

The Dean and new Canon Chancellor move to the Quire and the Dean installs the new Canon Chancellor saying

Dean By virtue and authority of this Mandate, I do admit and install you, Gordon Giles, into a Canonry of this Cathedral Church and assign you a place in the Quire, according to the tenor and effect of the same Mandate and the statutes of this Realm in that behalf made.

> We welcome you into our fellowship with a glad heart. The Lord preserve your going out and your coming in, from this time forth and for ever more.

New Testament Reading: Acts 1.6-14 read by Paul Hudson, Lay Member of Chapter

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles.

When the apostles had come together, they asked Jesus, 'Lord, is this the time when you will restore the kingdom to Israel?' He replied, 'It is not for you to know the times or periods that the Father has set by his own authority. But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth.' When he had said this, as they were watching, he was lifted up, and a cloud took him out of their sight. While he was going and they were gazing up towards heaven, suddenly two men in white robes stood by them. They said, 'Men of Galilee, why do you stand looking up towards heaven? This Jesus, who has been taken up from you into heaven, will come in the same way as you saw him go into heaven.'

Then they returned to Jerusalem from the mount called Olivet, which is near Jerusalem, a sabbath day's journey away. When they had entered the city, they went to the room upstairs where they were staying, Peter, and John, and James, and Andrew, Philip and Thomas, Bartholomew and Matthew, James son of Alphaeus, and Simon the Zealot, and Judas son of James. All these were constantly devoting themselves to prayer, together with certain women, including Mary the mother of Jesus, as well as his brothers.
