PARTICULARS OF MEMBERSHIP

THE Association of the Friends of Rochester Cathedral was formed in 1935, as it was felt that there were many who would like to be associated with this ancient and interesting church and to have a share in the preservation and upkeep of the fabric.

The Diocese and Cathedral of Rochester go back to the beginning of English Christianity. This is not to be confused with Christianity in what we now speak of as England, for Christianity flourished in Kent soon after the year A.D. 200, and although there is no proof of a Christian Church in Rochester in those early days, there is at least a likelihood that there was one. The Mission sent by Pope Gregory the Great, and welcomed and aided by King Ethelbert, secured the founding of the See of Canterbury about A.D. 597, and those of Rochester and London in A.D. 604. Close to the West Door of the Cathedral the foundations of the apse of the old Saxon Church were discovered—semicircular lines just inside the Cathedral mark the site—and the foundations of its Nave walls were traced running westwards across the cemetery outside. No foundations of a western apse have been discovered. The Cathedral Church as it stands to-day is an interesting epitome of English architecture from early Norman to the present century—the latter represented by restoration work.

All who care for this venerable church are therefore asked to join the Association of Friends of Rochester

Cathedral, and thus to help the Dean and Chapter to bear the responsibility of preserving for future generations a building which stands for so much in the history of our National Church.

Since the inauguration over 2,600 Friends have enrolled themselves, and their contributions have resulted in much valuable work in several ways. Important and necessary repairs to the fabric have been carried out, especially to parapets, roofs, and copings. During the war, funds were supplied by the Friends for defence work against bomb damage, blast, and fire. But it is especially due to their efforts that there has been revealed the interest and beauty of the Monastic Cloisters, its buildings, and its garth. The Chapter House doorway has been opened and the exquisite Romanesque carving of its masonry shown. Within the Chapter House, Priors' burial places have been discovered; the foundations of the pillars which carried a gallery across the west end from the dormitory to the Cathedral have been exposed; the refectory doorway and its adjacent washing-trough have been made objects of interest; and the fine vaulted archway entered from the main road of the Precinct has been opened out. Of the Cellarer's buildings some walls have been shown, and the Tudor buttresses clearly tell what King Henry the Eighth planned for the housing of his retinue. Funds are urgently needed for all this work. Will you become a Friend and help?

The minimum subscription has been fixed at £1 per annum, which it is hoped will enable all who wish to do so to enrol themselves, but it is also hoped that many will be able to give larger sums. There is also a Corporate Membership for Schools, Colleges, Parochial Church Councils, etc., with a minimum subscription of £1 per annum, whilst Individual Life Membership is £10, or Joint Life Membership, for husband and wife, £15 15s. Boys and girls under 18 years of age, 2s. per annum. Each Friend receives a Card of Membership

and a copy of the Annual Report is sent to each Member other than Junior Members, when published. A form of application will be found at the end of this Report and should be sent to the Honorary Secretary, The Precinct, Rochester.

Friends who visit the Cathedral and attend Festivals are asked to wear the Badge of Membership, illustrated on the cover. It consists of a gold scallop on a red field with the words "Friends of Rochester Cathedral" round the rim and the date of the inception. Badges are 2s. 0d. (1s. 6d. for Junior Members) and may be obtained from the Honorary Secretary.

THE Council's meetings are always a tonic. The members are full of enthusiasm and good suggestions. Behind them stands the great body of the Friends. It is good that so many people love and care for their Cathedral.

Sir Albert Stern has retired from the Council after a membership of many years. Lady Stern is welcomed in his place. Brigadier J. G. Carr, R.E., has retired after a useful two years and is succeeded by the new Commandant, Brigadier I. H. Lyall Grant, M.C., M.A.

We are grateful to the Rev. P. M. Sharp, who continues to act as Honorary Secretary and Treasurer, to Mr. Cook who has given valuable service for two years, to Miss Hitchen and to Miss V. Black who is now also giving great help in the office.

In last year's Report I said that the Friends had agreed to pay the cost of cleaning the Nave as and when they could. So great was the enthusiasm that special gifts poured in to the total of £1,225. This, with the funds already available, enabled the whole job to be done last summer, and paid for. Well done, the Friends! The story is told on page 8 under the heading of "The Nave".

THE NAVE

THE FRIENDS have cleaned the Nave—their biggest undertaking yet.

Gundulph began his Cathedral at the East End about A.D. 1080, but was soon at work on the Nave. So those lovely nine bays are as old as any Norman cathedral in the country. The West Front was built early in the twelfth century in the bishopric of John of Canterbury. The West Door, with its richly sculptured tympanum, is late Norman, and one of the most beautiful in England.

The Nave is in constant use for Ordinations, Confirmations, great diocesan occasions like the three Mothers Union Festivals this May, the three Diocesan Festivals in July, the Choirs Festivals, the Industrial Festival, the Cathedral Lectures, Services for the Navy, the Royal Engineers, the Hospitals and a number of Schools; Choral Society and other Concerts, Drama, and the Kings School Prizegiving.

The loudspeakers which the Friends installed were not entirely successful. They have now been re-sited on the columns and the result is quite satisfactory.

The real beauty of the Nave is seen when it is empty of chairs. This is not often possible, except for a good part of Lent and the late summer. In Lent the great Cross stands stark and alone on its bed of stone at the head of the Nave. At Christmas the Crib stands there. At other times the Nave Altar stands on a platform at the foot of the steps to the Choir. This platform is not worthy of the Cathedral and we hope to improve it with money recently subscribed for the purpose.

The cleaning operation was completed during the summer holiday period of 1964, and was a rare example of a job being finished by the promised date. We are grateful to Wallis's of Maidstone. The Nave was shut off from the rest of the Cathedral by a huge

polythene curtain while the walls and columns were washed and floods of dirty water were pumped outside. Plaster was repaired and coloured to match the stone.

The shields on the corbels supporting the roof trusses were repainted with coats of arms, ecclesiastical on the south, civil on the north. A list of these appears on page 10. They had been previously painted (rather indifferently) in the reign of Elizabeth I.

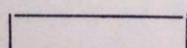

REPORT OF THE HON. SECRETARY AND TREASURER

MEMBERSHIP

IT IS good to be able to report that we are now on the 1,300 mark and this has been accomplished quite steadily, although we should like to see the rate of growth stepped up.

The annual subscription of 5s. had remained unchanged since 1935. The Council last October voted to increase this and the corporate subscription to £1 for new members. All those at the old rate are still valid, of course, though it is hoped that many will be able to increase their annual amount to bring it more into line with the value of money in these difficult days.

FINANCE

The renovation of the Nave, including the painting of the bosses (see page 10) and the gilding of parts of the chandeliers, cost in all £3,050 and this has been paid by the Friends. The final payment of £250 to Messrs. Wallis has been made, but could not figure in this year's account. Naturally, apart from our reserve of £500 Defence Bonds and the Life subscriptions, which are not treated as income, the ordinary funds are depleted.

CHRISTMAS CARDS

Owing to circumstances beyond our control, it was not found possible to issue a new card for 1964, but 1,700 of last year's were sold, giving us a profit of £18.

We hope to have a coloured photograph of the Theological College and Spire of the Cathedral taken last Autumn, made into an attractive card for 1965.

GENERAL

We should like to thank all those Friends who have helped the Cathedral in many ways during the past year, in particular:

Mr. Eric Blatchly whose excellent photograph of the Nave can be seen in this Report.

Mr. Lewis Black who printed and framed all the prayers in the Lady Chapel, and who made the new Rear Music Desks for use in the Nave.

Mr. R. H. Langdon whose fine new case for the postcards has made the display much more attractive.

All those who have introduced new Friends during the year. If each Friend would enrol only one new member, the membership could be doubled before the next Festival.

We are grateful, as always, to Mr. Hoby and Mr. Sinden for the annual audit of the accounts.

Mr. Cook has now left us and we are all much in his debt; but Miss Black and Miss Hitchen now carry the bulk of the office work most willingly and well, whilst Miss Neech continues to send out the monthly reminders and generally to keep us all on the right lines.
